



Breakfast!

Winter Warmer event

On Saturday 27th January, working in partnership with Cadent Gas, we had a stall at St Clements Winter warmer event. We were handing out room thermometers, leaflets on what to do in a Gas emergency, cold caller stickers and winter warmer packs to those who signed up to the priority services register (PSR). The winter warmer packs contain a blanket, hat, gloves, and thermal

socks. The PSR is a completely free service, designed to make it easier for those

who need a little extra help. Each energy supplier and electricity network operator maintain their own register, meaning that you can register with us and receive essential benefits that will make the management of your energy supply easier. Catharine the community Champion from ASDA Trafford Park also joined us. We signed up 11 people to the register. We will be talking about this at our other events too should you want to





know more information.


